LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE

Introduction: Week Four

On our journey to Christmas, we have lit the candles of Hope, Peace, and Joy on our Advent Wreath. These candles remind us of the hope that Christ will come again, bringing everlasting peace, and joy. This is the fourth Sunday of Advent, so we light the last candle, the candle of Love. Today's candle is lit to draw our hearts to the magnitude of God's love for us that was made manifest in Jesus.

Readers Week Four

The angel Gabriel reassured Mary that "nothing will be impossible with God." The power of love is the power to overcome what we think is impossible in our lives. As we light the candle of Love, we remember that God so loves this world that he sent his only son, Jesus, to save us. We light this candle in honor of those who have shown us how to love even when doing so is not convenient or sensible. We remember those who show us that compassion – unconditional love – is how we are called to live our lives.

Christ connects all the Advent candles. Through him we can find hope, peace, joy, and love. Christ steps down into darkness to bring light to the world. Through Jesus we hold God's love in our hearts. Love was the hope of the saints and the call of the prophets. It was the fire in the belly of the Baptist, the courage of Mother Mary, and the obedience of Joseph. Lamp in the window, beacon on the hill, star in the night sky. These symbols of light point to the One who loves us more than we can imagine.

As we remain seated, let us pray together: Father of lights, we light these candles of hope, of peace, of joy, and today of love, to prepare our hearts and lives so that we may again receive the gift of Christ and, through him, salvation. Break into our world and our hearts again. Magnify your love in us until it overflows to our family, friends, and neighbors. Renew our faith to experience again the wonder of your love. Prepare our hearts to be transformed by you so that we may shine the light of your compassionate love in this broken world. Come, God of Love, come. Amen.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy dearly-beloved Son Jesus Christ.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies. Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and

Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; and also that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord;
